TABLE 1: Common Clinical Features at The Time of Presentation With CVT[^]

Presenting symptom	Prevalence (%)
Headache	87-89%
Seizure	24-40%
Focal Neurologic Deficits	18-48%
Depressed Level of Consciousness/encephalopathy	18-22%
Visual Loss	13-27%
Diplopia/other cranial neuropathies	11-14%
